- WAGE THEFT LEGISLATION -

HD1828 // SD1802

An Act preventing wage theft, promoting employer accountability, and enhancing public enforcement.

Wage theft is when contractors exploit workers by paying them under the table, sometimes withholding wages or failing to pay them entirely. They also avoid contributing to unemployment insurance and workers' compensation while violating worksite safety standards. These unfair practices steal billions from workers and the state, and put honest contractors at a disadvantage.

Wage Theft doesn't just affect a few people. Across all industries, more than two million workers suffer wage theft or are illegally misclassified as independent contractors. Across the nation, construction workers alone have \$946 million a year stolen from them. This hurts workers, honest contractors who can't compete, and taxpayers.

WHAT DOES THIS LEGISLATION DO?

- **Promotes Accountability:** Holds lead contractors responsible for the wage theft violations of their subcontractors, as long as there is a significant connection to their business activities or operations.
- Levels the Playing Field: Ensures fair competition by requiring all businesses to follow labor laws.
- **Empowers Enforcement:** Allows the Attorney General's Office to take wage theft cases to court and issue stop-work orders.
- **Generates Revenue:** Brings in penalties for wage theft, ensuring enforcement even when resources are limited.
- **Protects Workers from Retaliation:** Workers can take legal action to recover unpaid wages without fear of retaliation or coercion to waive their rights.
